Foundation 1 2024- 2025 'Achieving Together'

Literacy

- Continue to understand key concepts about print, such as naming different parts of a book and knowing we read from left to right and top to bottom
- Take part in conversations about stories and learn new vocabulary
- Identify rhyme
- Begin to recognise words with the same initial sound
- Write some or all of the letters in their first name
- Continue to enjoy drawing freely

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Enjoy roles of responsibility in school and understand that we belong to a community e.g. school
- Extend and develop play ideas when playing with friends
- Select and use activities independently, but ask for help if needed
- Remember and increasingly follow our class rules without reminders
- Make healthy choices about food, drink and activities
- With adult support, talk and find solutions to conflicts such as sharing resources or accepting our friends' ideas

Physical Development

- Continue to develop movement, balance and ball skills
- Travel up, along, over and under apparatus
- Show increasing independence with dressing and undressing skills e.g. putting on and taking off a coat
- Use 1 handed tools and equipment e.g. making snips in paper with scissors
- Use a dominant hand for writing; demonstrating good control

Mathematics

- Recognise numbers to 10 and match quantity to the correct numeral
- Find 1 more and 1 less than a number up to 5
- Say the days of the week in the correct order
- Name and describe 2D and 3D shapes
- Recognise, continue and create repeating patterns
- Begin to recognise the quantity of up to 3 objects, without having to count them individually (subitise).

Communication and Language

- Enjoy listening to longer stories and talk about what happened
- Understand questions or instructions that have two parts
- Use a wider range of vocabulary i.e. topic related words
- Start and continue a conversation for many turns, with friends or an adult

Expressive Arts and Design

- Explore colour and shape by making a paper shape animal collage, and learn about the work of Henri Matisse
- Make a glove or stick animal puppet
- Learn traditional rhymes from other countries
- Create musical patterns using body percussion

Understanding the World

- Show respect for ourselves, others and belongings
- Begin to understand that Jesus is a special person to Christians and listen to some Bible stories
- Learn about Chinese New Year and how it is celebrated
- Africa – where is it? Learn about wild animals, traditional music and foods
